GGKP invites the submission of abstracts for policy-relevant papers on fiscal instruments that address the following issues:

- Designing effective green tax reforms
- Overcoming obstacles to green fiscal reform (including the preparation of separate green budget statements in the process of preparing annual budgets)
- Measuring the effectiveness of fiscal policy
- Addressing the applicability of environmental taxes
- Successful reform of environmentally harmful subsidies
- Promoting low-carbon transportation systems
- Creating incentives for investment in clean technology
- Enabling socially equitable and environmentally friendly water management
- Promoting clean energy
- Managing solid waste
- Addressing obstacles to intergovernmental cooperation (horizontal and vertical)
- Other topics at the intersection of green growth and fiscal instruments.

Researchers are invited to submit abstracts of papers to be presented at the conference on the themes identified above. Papers should have clear policy relevance. Preference will be given to those that successfully demonstrate the linkages of their analysis to policy outcomes in the transition to a green economy. The best young-researcher (under 35) and the best overall papers will be recognized with awards at the conference.

Abstracts should include:

- a) A summary of chosen topic and its importance
- b) Description of methodology and geographical coverage of paper
- c) Whether/how it addresses a knowledge gap (it should not be a recycled topic or something well-known)
- d) Policy relevance and applicability to various countries
- e) Potential distributional impacts of the fiscal instrument covered in the paper
- f) Expected results and implications for further research

Abstracts should be **no longer than two-pages** in length and must be submitted electronically **in .pdf format** to **conference@ggkp.org** no later than **15 September 2014 with the submission form**. Acceptance of abstracts for papers will be notified by email.
